MINUTES OF MEETING ~~NOVEMBER 9, 1970~~ NOVEMBER 9, 1970.

Meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Chairman Herndon, with Messrs. Evans, Spaulding, Smith, and Thomson present.

- (1) Chairman Herndon noted that there is a meeting scheduled for Monday 11-30 8PM under new rules for meeting second and fifth Mondays of each month.
- (2) A public meeting for start the long-range-planning committees into action is planned for Wednesday 12-2 at Wilkins School 8PM.
- (3) Messrs. Constantines and Benjamin, plus 11 interested townspeople listened and commented as the P.B. discussed Long Range Planning and the structure and objectives of the segments of the effort.

Mr. Constantines will concentrate on field work, research for data and statistics from state agencies, and with liaison between Carlisle and adjoining towns.

Mr. Benjamin will take a long range view of our objectives and progress and have the advantage of commenting on our work without getting too closely involved with the actual nuts and bolts.

A tally of those present was taken and their names were placed with those who had previously reported their interest in the opportunity of working with the P.B. on this project. The public sector of Carlisle, outside of town officialdom, seems well represented and has a wealth of ability to contribute to the project, according to Chairman Herndon. It is up to the P.B. to use that talent to the best possible end.

- (4) Monday 12-14 8PM is the next regular meeting for December '70, in addition to the special meeting Wed. 12-2 on long range plans.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 PM, after which the Board met in executive session to consider the input of the Town Center Traffic Study and the use of its conclusions. The P.B. decided to put this report into the Long Range Planning mill at the appropriate time.
