NORTHEAST LABORATORIES, INC. (NEL) SAMPLING INSTRUCTIONS

Sampling time and date is on a first come, first served basis. There are only 40 slots available. You may choose a 30-minute time block but appointments are not guaranteed; only completed, paid applications will be added to the list and confirmed.

Someone over 18 must be home to provide access for NEL.

Residents should make sure that the sampling location is easily accessible and fully functional prior to the field technician arriving. Old valves, spigots, etc. will often break or begin to leak during use if they have not been used in a long time. NEL, Inc. cannot be responsible for damage to plumbing or resulting property damage.

NEL requests that residents remove any filtration or aeration devices and run the cold water for 5 minutes prior to the technician arriving. Not all faucets have a removable aerator. For residents requesting Total Coliform and/or Radon testing, they should select a sampling location with a removable aerator.

NEL will call residents when they are on the way. If no one answers the phone the technician may move to the next home. If running ahead of schedule NEL will call the next resident on the list to ask if we may come early.

If a home needs to be skipped (e.g., emergency, resident not answering phone, etc.), NEL will schedule another date and time with the resident. The Board of Health asks that residents do everything they can to keep their scheduled appointment or to let us know beforehand if they need to reschedule.

NEL is happy to answer questions before or after sampling, but the field technicians will not have time to answer anything but the most basic questions onsite. Residents with questions about what to test for, ideal testing location, interpretation of results, etc. should call the lab (978) 777-4442 M-F from 7 am to 5:30 pm and ask to speak with Tyler or Shelley.

In the event of results exceeding drinking water standards, NEL, Inc. will notify the resident within 24 hours even if the rest of the report is not ready.

Final report turnaround times are dictated by the parameter that takes the longest amount of time to analyze. Approximate turnaround times are as follows:

Total Coliform P/A: 1 business day

Standard Package, Volatile Organic Compounds, Radon: 10 business days

PFAS: 20 business days

Gross Alpha: 30-40 business days

Results will be delivered via email to both the resident and to the Board of Health for the town property files which are Public Record. Email addresses for report delivery (resident and Board of Health) will also be indicated on the Chain of Custody for each project.
