**In addition, the Applicant must:**

1. Provide the Land Stewardship Committee with a photo ID confirming the applicant’s address (such as a Driver’s License or other government issued ID).
2. Surrender any previously issued Town of Carlisle Metal Detecting Permits that have been issued to the applicant.
3. Carry the permit while engaging in any metal detecting on Carlisle Conservation Land.
4. Submit a list of all significant finds located on Carlisle Conservation Land as a consequence of this permit to The Carlisle Historical Society.

**Definitions:**

Recent Coins: Any coin that is less than 50 years old may be kept by the finder. Coin(s) that are more than fifty years old must be reported to the Carlisle Historical Society who may either elect to keep the coin(s) or allow the finder to keep the coin(s).

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Historically Significant Objects: The Historical Society must be notified within one week if any object of historical, paleontological or archeological nature or any coin or object whose value significantly exceeds its face value is found. The Historical Society reserves the right to retain possession of artifacts deemed historically significant.

Identifiable Personal Property: Any objects whose owner could potentially be identified (ex. jewelry, car keys, dog tags, etc.) must be surrendered to the Carlisle Police Department within two days of being found..

Valuable Items: Pursuant to state law, any object worth more than \$3.00 must be surrendered to the Carlisle Police Department within two days but may be redeemed by the finder if unclaimed after one year.

Trash: Any object found to hold no monetary or historical value (ex. cans, pull tabs, modern nails etc.) must be properly disposed of by the finder.

I hereby certify that the information I have provided on this form is complete and accurate to the best of my knowledge. I agree to abide by the terms set forth in this application, the metal detecting Rules and Regulation and the Town of Carlisle Conservation Land Use Rules and Regulations. I understand that failure to do so may lead to cancellation of this permit, the denial of future permits or other action by the Carlisle Land Stewardship Committee .

In addition, I hereby acknowledge and agree that any and all objects I find while metal detecting on Town owned property shall, at the option of the Carlisle Historical Society, become property of the Town.
